# CORNELL'S JOURNEY WITH US

Cornell Mark Stephenson began the great race called life on December 18, 1962, as the youngest of eight children born to the late Henry Clay Sr. and Inez Valencia Stephenson.

Born at Prince George's Hospital Center in Cheverly, MD, and raised in nearby Cedar Heights, Cornell was shaped by the values his parents instilled in each of their children—faith, family, and hard work. They often reminded them, "Always do your best, don't start trouble...but handle your business if trouble arrives!" Those words became a quiet compass for how Cornell lived—with integrity, courage, and an unshakable sense of self.

Cornell was baptized as a teenager, and throughout his life, he carried his faith beyond the pews through his forgiveness of others and his generosity of spirit, qualities that touched everyone who knew him. He was a member of the First Baptist Church of Highland Park, lovingly known as "the family church."

He was educated in the Prince George's County Public School System, where his athleticism and competitive spirit were evident from an early age. In fourth grade, his favorite teacher, Mr. Hall, recognized his natural talent and placed him in the anchor position on the relay team, sparking what would become a lifelong love of track and field. Even as a boy, Cornell dreamed beyond his neighborhood, telling his parents in middle school that he would one day move to Los Angeles, where the weather was warm and the entertainment world awaited him.

Cornell graduated from Fairmont Heights High School in 1980, where he distinguished himself as a stellar student-athlete. During his senior year, he was inducted into the National Honor Society, won three gold medals in the indoor track state championships, and earned one gold medal outdoors.

Following in the footsteps of his sister Deborah, Cornell attended Hampton University, where he was inspired to major in accounting, just like Deborah's husband, Ronald. Cornell served as treasurer of the National Association of Black Accountants and joined the National Society of Pershing Rifles, Uniform-4. But the highlight of his Hampton years came in the spring of 1982, when he pledged Kappa Alpha Psi Fraternity, Inc., a brotherhood he cherished for life. He remained an active and devoted member for over 40 years, most recently with the Hyattsville/Landover Alumni Chapter.

After graduating from Hampton in 1984, Cornell packed up his white Mustang and drove cross-country to Los Angeles, California on December 26, 1985.

Carolyn Frances Mooney Scriber peacefully transitioned on Wednesday, June 4, 2025. She was born on June 17, 1948, to Narvail, Sr. and Inez Mooney, in Brevard, North Carolina. She was the third of 6 children and their first-born girl. Carolyn was baptized at Tabernacle Baptist Church and later converted to Catholicism and was a faithful member of St. Joseph's Catholic Church, Largo, Maryland.

Carolyn was a beautiful woman, within & without. She was smart, hard-working, loyal, lovely, fun, spiritual, had a great sense of humor and was cloaked in a delightfully optimistic and winsome aura. She was multi-faceted -- intelligent, industrious, and the consummate professional, yet she had a special affinity for the "Godfather of Soul", James Brown and the minute she heard him belt out "I Feel Good", Carolyn would be the 1st one on the dance floor! She was also a great cook, loved hosting friends and family, and would send you on your way with a nice care package, too, even fairly recently when not feeling particularly well. Oh, and she wouldn't refuse a cold beer, either. Carolyn LOVED her family, spending time with them and lovingly sharing stories - and photos - of family weddings, births, graduations and other gatherings. Carolyn loved playing cards, traveling, eating Chesapeake Bay crabs and the BEACH. She was a dear friend to so many of us, as well. In essence, to know Carolyn was to love her. How could you not?

Carolyn was homegrown in her beloved Prince George's County, hailing from the historic Black Town of Fairmount Heights. She attended Fairmont Heights High School under renowned Principal, James Gholson. In 1965, as a junior in high school, she attended the Annual Capital Cab Picnic, as always, but this particular year, she met a young man named Bill Scriber. They were instantly smitten with each other, took a long walk and Bill summoned the nerve to ask for her phone number. Neither one had paper or pen, so as they passed a quite dusty "hoopty", Bill used his finger to etch her number in the dust on the car and they proceeded to walk back to the picnic. Mesmerized and on a newfound "mission", Bill retrieved pen & paper, hurried to retrace the path and copy down the number before rain or a gust of wind erased it or the car took off. And the rest is HISTORY!

Carolyn graduated from Fairmont Heights in 1966 and later attended Morgan State College where she forged lifelong friends and a cherished sisterhood, known as "The Summer Sistas". She married that determined young man, her soon-to-be lifelong partner, Bill, in 1968 while a student there. Carolyn transferred to and graduated from Bowie State College home of her beloved "Bulldogs". Carolyn later went on to obtain her Master's Degree from The University of Maryland.

Carolyn worked for Head Start for a good while. Years later, then-County Executive Parris Glendening was astute enough to hire the cream of the crop in Carolyn to serve in the upper echelon of his administration. She was a trusted advisor and ultimately a dear friend to him. In fact, THREE Prince George's County Executives were savvy enough to recognize Carolyn's many professional attributes and work ethic. Some years later, our homegrown County Executive Wayne Curry appointed Carolyn as Director of Central Services for Prince George's County. She was an integral part of his Cabinet and Carolyn SOARED in her role! During this time, she was the well-deserved recipient of the prestigious "Gladys Noon Spellman" Award for Excellence in County Government! Carolyn retired from the Prince George's Governemt.

Carolyn departed this life on June 4th, having courageously fought the good fight with tremendous grace & without complaint. She was 76-years-young and passed just 2 weeks shy of her 77th birthday. She & Bill were married for an amazing 56 years, closing in on 57 in August. Sadly, Carolyn & Bill lost their only son, Ricky, in 1994. Prayerfully, she & her beloved Ricky are now reunited.

Carolyn was a beautiful, vibrant spirit and will be sorely missed. We are ALL better off for knowing her. How BLESSED are we that Carolyn Mooney Scriber passed our way. Rest in peace, Dear Carolyn, and THANK YOU for giving your ALL...




